REOPENING OF KNEPP LANE FOOTPATH

Further to the report in our December Newsletter regarding the positive outcome of the application to reopen Knepp Lane, WSCC Highways dept. have very quickly taken action to clear and open the path and construct a new bridge across the stream. The entrances to the path, just north of the canal crossing by The Onslow Arms and in Station Road just over the hill as you leave the village, are both clearly signposted with a green 'Public Footpath' sign. The path is a convenient route for walkers from The Onslow Arms to the footpaths that run from Station road across to Merryhills and the woodland beyond. It is a pleasant countryside walk which avoids the centre of the village, enjoy it!

Neighbourhood Plan Update

Following on from the public meeting which was held just before last Christmas last year at which it was decided to start the process of updating the Neighbourhood Plan, a new Steering Group has now been formed consisting of 4 parish councillors and 4 members of the public. One meeting has been held and the Steering Group is in the process of mapping out a strategy to address Chichester District Councils (CDC) proposals for 125 new houses in Loxwood.

CDC has now published the results of the draft Local Plan consultation which took place earlier this year. The draft district wide parish housing policy with allocates the housing allocations for all the parishes in the district, which proposes 125 houses for Loxwood, received approximately 230 comments. **Over 100** of those comments came from Loxwood residents.

Well done Loxwood!

Thank you to all those residents who sent letters to CDC.

We will have to wait and see what changes CDC make to the draft Plan before deciding what to do next.
