## Cushing's Column

Dear Friends,

You've all heard of the C of E – the Church of England. Well, before I came to truly believe in Jesus, I used to joke that I was C and E – a Christmas and Easter churchgoer!

Well, if I'm honest, I don't think there are too many C and E churchgoers anymore. I think there are a lot of C churchgoers – because our society still likes to embrace the good old Christmas Carols by Candlelight; and dress up as angels, shepherds and sheep in Crib Nativities. Sadly, however the E has been forgotten. The tradition of Easter eggs and the Easter bunny doesn't seem to be as connected to the Church as carols and nativity plays are, and so our Easter services tend to be a lot less busy than our Christmas services.

I find this sad, because one could say that at Easter we engage with a depth of God's love we do not see anywhere near as vividly at Christmas. At Easter we hear of a God who loves us so much that He willingly chose to lay down His life for His friends. Would you count yourself a friend of God?

That's the message of Easter – there is a way each of us can be friends with God, it is the most amazing news, and the door is opened at the cross of Christ at Calvary.

One of the most comforting sentiments I often receive from a friend is when after pouring my heart out they say to me, "*Greg, can I pray for you*?" Well, did you know that Jesus, who'll be your best friend ever is praying for you right now?

Let me close with the words of a hymn I came across in our Lent book 'An Ocean of Grace' recently from Anne Steele back in the 18<sup>th</sup> Century:

He lives, the great Redeemer lives. What joy this blest assurance gives! And now before his Father God, Pleads the full merit of his blood.

## Always Through The Church. Always Hope

You may not be aware that Alfold and Loxwood church has a longstanding policy of tithing (giving 10%) of its unrestricted income each year to various mission agencies and charities. In the first of an occasional series, this article focuses on the work of one of those recipients, Christians Against Poverty (CAP).

Having previously struggled with debt himself, John Kirkby started CAP in Bradford in 1996 with a donation of  $\pm 10$  and great faith. He believed God was calling him to sacrifice his career in finance and use his knowledge of the industry to help the poor.

He met people crippled by debt: parents who couldn't feed their children, families facing eviction and desperate people living in fear and without hope. He used his expertise to negotiate with creditors, set up budgeting systems and offer a lifeline to those trapped in debt.

Since then, CAP has spread throughout the country and now internationally. It specialises in free debt counselling for people in financial difficulty and looks at all options for them including bankruptcy. It works through a network of debt counsellors from local churches who reach out to those in their communities who are struggling with mounting bills. Social workers, family support workers, and mental health charities also refer clients to CAP.

Clients give CAP authority to negotiate with their creditors and it advises them on how they can organise their finances so as to make them debtfree. This includes devising a sustainable personal budget, prioritising basic living needs and offering creditors fair, affordable pro-rata payments as far as possible.

Many of the clients CAP help are classed as 'vulnerable' – they were already facing significant challenges before the weight of debt landed on them. It is very aware of the need to handle them with extra care.

CAP is careful never to apply pressure or imply that being or becoming a Christian is a condition of getting help. Typically, just 4% of clients do become Christians. However, many who are helped to go debt free (typically 2,500 each year) say their lives are transformed.

CAP also provides Job Clubs for those seeking employment, Life Skills groups to help people develop practical skills to survive on a low income and develop their confidence and Fresh Start Courses for people looking to overcome addictions. The CAP Money Course, which teaches basic budgeting skills, is available in a number of formats, for children, young people, students and adults.

Money-saving expert and TV presenter Martin Lewis says "CAP are unsurpassed when it comes to the debt help they give people across the country. There's nothing better to start you on the path to having more money in your pocket".

#### As CAP's strapline puts it, 'Always through the church, always hope'.

## Loxwood Parish Council

**NORTH HALL PLAYGROUND RESURFACE** In order that the North Hall Playground can become an all-weather facility for younger children the Parish Council has paid for the laying of a wet pour surface which by the time you read this article will be in situ. The money for this project is part of the Community Investment Levy (CIL) that the Parish received as a result of the development at Nursery Green. Other projects that have been part funded by these monies include the North Hall Car Park and the new outdoor classroom as the Local School. The Parish receive 25% of any CIL monies paid by residential site developers and this is an elevated percentage as the Parish has a Neighbourhood Plan.

**REVISION TO THE NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN** The consultation on the Draft revised Loxwood Neighbourhood Plan took place last autumn. Since then, your comments were addressed to form the Submission Neighbourhood Plan and consequently the Revised Neighbourhood Plan is now with Chichester District Council, who will in due course carry out a further Consultation on the Plan this being the Regulation 16 Consultation. The Parish Council are hoping this would have been carried out by now in order for the Plan to be progressed to Examination and subject to the Examiner's remarks Referendum as soon as possible. However, Chichester District Council is experiencing delays in receiving comments from Statutory Bodies which are required before the Plan can proceed to the next stage. The Parish Council will continue to press for action but we are informed this delay is a County wide delay.







I never realised how much technology is needed these days just to discuss church matters. It seemed that everyone had brought their laptop, so they could refer to all the diocesan briefing documents and reports that you mentioned. I've been in the diocese 40 years and have never heard of most of those papers. But then I find it too easy to delete the diocesan mailings, unread, with a click of my mouse.

Our church meetings are far more traditional. Since the church floor seems to have been carved out of permafrost, our meetings circulate round members' houses. This introduces a nice element of competition, as each host tries to outdo the previous one in the baking of cakes. Meetings at Colonel Drinkwater's – a more inappropriate name one cannot imagine – are the shortest, since we are always promised wine once the meeting is over. It is remarkable how unanimity is achieved on every subject within minutes, and nothing appears under "any other business".

Mrs Eddington never troubles us with minutes, largely because she can rarely read the notes she takes. She just shares with us whatever she *can* decipher at our next meeting. Last month, she accidentally brought her shopping list instead, and so read that out. There followed a lively discussion on whether carrots from our local shop were better than those at the supermarket. When it was found out she intended to use them in a venison casserole, endless recipes were keenly debated.

We always leave our church meetings well fed, up to date with village gossip, and totally untroubled by any church council business. And the lack of any minutes ensures that I can then make all the decisions myself, between meetings. I think you will find our system has much to be commended.
