### Cushing's Column

Dear Friends,

A year ago, when confronted with Covid financial worries, plus the financial hits of taking on a new curate and a potential building reordering – I challenged the church family of Alfold & Loxwood Parish to think inventively about raising money for church. I didn't realise at that stage that the challenge would be thrown back in my face, "You think you're pretty fit Rev Greg," taunted Richard Allan (a GB age grouped tri-athlete might I add!), "...why don't we do a Lands End to John O Groats cycle – if a few donated £1 a mile that's £1000!"

"Great idea," thinking most certainly that this was just conjecture and male bravado. But then it happened – somehow we completed it in 7 days from  $12^{th}$ -18<sup>th</sup> July 2021.

We'd set up a JustGiving page (which is still up and running by the way), and alongside external donations we're very near our goalposts of 10k. We're incredibly grateful to over 90 donors, many of whom are not churchgoers, and especially thankful for slightly irreverent prayers to cope with sore bottoms. lokes aside, I love that line "God gives the dignity of causality to our prayers," and there were some incredible-providential-prayer -answered moments on our trip. Like the time my tire blew with a shotgun banging sound in a small village in the middle of nowhere, and then lo and behold at just the right time a bloke pops up saying, "hi chaps, are you okay, I run a bike shop 10 miles away and have my van just here..." what were the chances! Or there was the time on the A9 just north of Inverness when a black transit van tried to overtake an arctic lorry right in front of us, lost control, its back end swerved out, and in that moment I wouldn't have been surprised if behind the scenes an angel had held up the van to stop it from rolling into us. Suffice to say we're thankful for answered prayer - God is good. And finally, a huge, huge, thanks must be expressed to Ruth Allan our support vehicle who was integral to our completion. She never faltered and again popped up with refreshments in places we hadn't even planned on meeting her, just when we were wilting, like manna from heaven. We were probably burning 7/8000 calories a day, sitting for 10-12hrs a day on a bike, and therefore like cars guzzling fuel, eating whatever was on offer - doughnuts, Cornish pasties, Scottish meat pies, basically anything!



Not to say everyone is left by the side of the road in Guildford, but there are many who end up becoming very vulnerable at night, and having a team of care-givers who provide support, care and assistance to get home safely is vital. Guildford has just reopened fully its leisure and entertainment venues (until around 3am on Friday and Saturday nights), and provision for the homeless is also uncertain, so we know the need will only grow again.

There are many reasons why people become vulnerable, whether through separation, effects of homelessness, intoxication or physical harm – and the Street Angel approach of helping whoever, non-judgementally, underpins all of what we do. I can certainly attest to never having a quiet night over the past 3 years of involvement, whether leading a team or being part of one, and our role on the night is as varied from one night to the next. It is the conversations we have with people that stand out – whether they have specific needs, just want a chat, value some friendly words, or can be encouraged as they work around town or on the doors. Meeting people where they are at, is where we long to be. When I first went out on a taster night, it was promised that I would love the training – they weren't wrong. That period of initial training, which I am now redoing as a 3-yearly update, was instrumental in firming up the call to serve there, but has brought new friendships and really opened my eyes to seeing the world through new perspectives.

For those who long to get involved – there are two easy ways. Firstly – check out the website below, and watch the video to get a taste of what it might look like. If you think this could be you, then sign up to come out on a taster night. Secondly – we value support too; both in prayer, and financial giving to the Guildford Town Centre Chaplaincy, who oversee the work of the Angels. Fundraising and raising the profile are also massive parts of the mission. I can remember jangling a bucket on a street corner or running a leg in the great Guildford pancake day relays on the high street in a set of angel wings – not only great fun, it really builds community feeling too. https://gtcc.org.uk/streetangels/


